1) First of all, i was confused about codec - its APE (monkey's audio), not FLAC. FLAC music works fine.

2) Bug happens also without CUE...

3) I tested that:

- all plugins was disabled
- ffmpeg plugin was enabled

Bug still exist. It seems like something wrong with ffmpeg.

Maybe I should rebuild ffmpeg with different options? All available ffmpeg options is here <http://www.freshports.org/multimedia/ffmpeg/> but i cant find any info about ape codec. Thats weird...
