Windows 10 is just broken like that. The Windows 10 "accent color" does not change the actual color theme, even for native apps like Notepad.

Windows still has real color themes, like it has since Windows 3.x, but you have to go into the Registry now to find them¹. Audacious follows those color settings as do (some) native Windows apps.
